





At the time of this report, Kwanzaa, Christmas, and Christmas Eve are the holidays most in demand on Campspot during the winter and spring seasons.

RV CAMPER DEMOGRAPHIC DATA

- RV rental rates stayed steady from 2020 to 2021, at 13% of travelers. However, RVs are
 gaining popularity among younger demographics. 25% of travelers aged 18 to 34 took an RV
 trip in the last 12 months, an increase of seven percentage points over the previous year.
- RV trips usually involve a group of people traveling together. Family (35%) and friends (28%) top the list of traveling parties.
- According to internal data, 40% of RV renters are headed to a private or public campground when renting, followed by lake destinations and sporting events.
- 47% of younger travelers (18 to 34) are eager to take an RV trip in the next 12 months. Half or more also want the convenience of an RV that is delivered and set up prior to their arrival.

TRAVEL TRENDS AND RV CAMPER PREFERENCES

- What are people listening to?
 - 35% are listening to curated playlists
 - 30% are listening to local radio stations
 - 24% prefer to chat with their family and friends
 - 17% prefer to listen to podcasts
 - 14% like audio books
- 50% prefer to make homemade snacks or meals on their trips, and 26% claim they prefer gas station/convenience store snacks. Only 15% prefer fast food drive-thru.
- 56% say their go-to drink on the road is water, 20% prefer coffee/tea, and 13% want soda
- 64% of travelers prefer to park and eat if they stop for food
- The most popular roadside attractions:
 - State parks (26%)
 - Locations with water for a quick dip (20%)
 - Unique and local roadside attractions (e.g., the largest ball of yarn) (16%)
- Hiking trails, historical markers, and diners or dives were at the bottom of the list, along with museums

- 2. Have the RV delivered. That's right, you don't have to drive an RV in order to enjoy an RV camping trip. Many owners on the RVshare platform are happy to deliver the RV to your destination, and will even set it up at your campsite. 



Route 100 VERMONT

This lesser-known scenic route stretches from the Massachusetts border up to Canada. The 211-mile road winds through quaint Vermont towns dotted with coffee shops, farm stands, ski resorts, and must-stop destinations like the Ben & Jerry's ice cream factory.

Peter Norbeck National Scenic Byway SOUTH DAKOTA


This scenic byway is shaped like a figure-eight and winds through the rugged landscape of the Black Hills in South Dakota. It includes the 14-mile Needles Highway, where you'll want to take your time along the winding road and through the narrow Needles Eye tunnel. Watch for glimpses of Mount Rushmore in the distance as you drive.

Scenic Byway 12 UTAH

Some of the most iconic red rock scenery in all of Utah can be found along this 123-mile scenic route that stretches from Capitol Reef National Park and Bryce Canyon National Park. Hike among the spires and chimneys in Kodachrome Basin State Park and enjoy the stunning views at Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument.

Pacific Coast Scenic Byway OREGON

Most folks think of California when planning a dreamy drive on the Pacific Coast Highway. Instead, escape the crowds and head north to drive the 363 miles of astonishing scenery along the Oregon coastline.









What are your top tips for hiking with infants and toddlers?

- Invest in a good carrier. There are many types of carriers that work for hiking. I am partial to a soft structured carrier for my babies and like to switch to a framed carrier when they are a little older. Find what works best for your situation.
- 2. Start close to home. Try to find a trail near you when you're first starting out. I love checking AllTrails and adjusting the filters to what I am looking for. Choose an easy trail that you can test out and get your feet dirty on.
- 3. Just go. You can probably think of a lot of things that will be hard about hiking with kids, but you'll figure it out once you hit the trail! Feeding your baby on the trail, changing diapers, and figuring out naps all come with practice and actually doing it.



Ask an Expert

What's your advice for campers looking to explore Alaska? Any must-see places or need-to-know tips?

Nothing can prepare you for your first experience in Alaska. It's a place that immediately makes you feel very small, yet very grateful. It's a destination where the wilderness swallows you up. This can feel a bit overwhelming at first, but if you come prepared, educate yourself, and embrace the Last Frontier, you will never be the same!

Top tips:

- 1. Be wild animal-aware! Visiting Alaska grants you an amazing opportunity to catch a glimpse of bears, moose, wolves, caribou, eagles, salmon, and the list goes on. It's exciting to see a wild animal, but just remember that they are exactly that, wild! Keep a safe distance away, don't separate from your group, and a good ole "hey bear" typically does the trick.
- 2. Keep your site clean! Use the bear-safe receptacles to store trash, and don't keep food on your person or in your tent. Use a bear box or a bear bag to store your food. If you are in a dispersed camping situation, pick a tree that is at least 200 feet away from camp, and hang your bag at least 15 feet from the ground. Arming yourself with bear spray can bring comfort when camping in Alaska, but be sure to check camp guidelines and permissions prior to doing so.
- 3. Dress for the occasion. Layers will be your best friend. Yes, Alaska can be very cold, but it can also be very hot, and very rainy. Always bring an extra pair of socks, and make sure your shoes are comfortable. I would recommend wearing pants when exploring the forests. Regional plants like Devils Club can cause skin reactions, and the locals will tell you the state bird of Alaska is the mosquito!

The last bit of advice I would share is to try EVERYTHING! Go see a glacier, eat some halibut, drink some local beer, play with an Alaskan husky, hike up a mountain, explore an old Gold Rush town. You are in Alaska, and it doesn't get much better than that!

Top Places to Spot Wildlife in Early 2023







Each passing month brings new reasons to travel, so if you are looking for an outdoor adventure in the new year that involves some epic animal sightings, here are a few destinations that are best visited in the first few months of 2023.



Baby Seals at Año Nuevo State Park

CALIFORNIA

Año Nuevo State Park is home to one of the world's largest mainland breeding colonies of elephant seals. Between mid-December and the end of March, up to 10,000 seals turn up, covering every inch of the beaches in the state park. Female elephant seals give birth to pups from late December to early February, and bulls can be seen fighting for their mates. There are daily naturalist-led walks available for visitors to see the seals up close.

Wintering Bald Eagles at Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve

ALASKA

The Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is home to the world's largest concentration of bald eagles and their critical habitat. It also sustains several natural salmon runs, including the "alluvial fan reservoir." The water in this large reservoir remains between 10 and 20 degrees above surrounding water temperatures, and this warmer water percolates into the Chilkat River, keeping it from freezing over in the winter. This open water and plentiful food supply of salmon attracts bald eagles to the area from October through February.

Bison at Yellowstone National Park

IDAHO, MONTANA, AND WYOMING

Yellowstone National Park, the world's first national park, is less crowded in winter, offering visitors views of steaming geyser basins and wildlife. During these cold months, bison are often seen making their way through the snow to warm themselves near geyser basins. There are between 2,300 and 5,500 bison living in two herds in the park, according to the National Park Service. As park roads are closed to the interior of the park, the only way to visit Old Faithful and other attractions in the winter is by guided snowcoach or snowmobile.

Where to Stay: Valley View RV Park Campground, Island Park, ID



Snowy Owls at Sachuest National Wildlife Refuge

RHODE ISLAND

Every year, some Northern American snowy owls will migrate to southern Canada and the northern half of the U.S. and can be spotted in the Northern Plains, New York, and New England. One great place to go looking for snowy owls is Sachuest National Wildlife Refuge in Rhode Island. Some banded snowy owls will return to the same wintering site year after year, and, according to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, the birds can be fiercely territorial about their wintering territory, even engaging in combat with other owls to protect their space.



Ask an Expert



What's the best way to properly handle a fish?

When I bring a fish in, I try to stress two major concepts: keep them wet and keep them horizontal. I like to keep fish in the net as long as possible to reduce their exposure to the air and, in late summer, the heat. Rubber nets are preferred, as they support a fish without removing scales or slime.

When I do bring the fish out of the net, I try to support them as best as I can with my hands underneath them. It's important to remember that fish are built for being horizontal and having their bodies supported by water. If you're trying to get a photo, don't hesitate to dunk the fish once or twice for their own sake and for a great drip effect in your photo.

The first hard freezes of the season can often come early in a lot of northern states. This can give you early and safe access to the ice, but it also dictates where you want to drill.

WHERE TO ICE FISH

Early December

During the early season freezes that can happen in December, the water is still warm enough to focus on shallower weed beds and points on the lake similar to where you would fish pre-freeze.





Later in the Season

As winter progresses, though, the warmer water will be deeper and so will the fish. By late December, you should be focusing on potholes, drop-offs, and deep rock outcroppings as the baitfish will have moved here to cope with the below-zero temperatures above. Your fishing depths are completely dependent on how deep the lake you're fishing is. Navionics depth charts on the Fishbrain App are perfect for identifying exactly where these features are.





Located in the eastern part of the state, this small town is 2.5 hours north of Acadia National Park and, as its name suggests, offers plenty of lake access—perfect for swimming, fishing, and outdoor adventures, no matter what time of year you visit.

What are Yellowstone National Park's must-see spots?

My first visit to Yellowstone National Park was with *Black People Who Hike* during their National Park Tour. A three-day trip focused on restorative healing, community, and exploring these must-see places! If you are cramped for time like we were, Yellowstone can seem a bit overwhelming, spanning more than 3,400 square miles from Montana to Wyoming. This short list of must-see destinations will make your trip planning easy!

- Geothermals: Old Faithful and Grand Prismatic are two of the most famous and recognizable geothermal features in the park. Getting its name from its predictable eruptions, Old Faithful still erupts in regular intervals of about 90 minutes or so and is quite the sight to see in person! Less than seven miles down the road is the famed blue pool known as Grand Prismatic Spring which, though now dormant, used to be an active geyser that erupted at heights of almost 300 feet!
- Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone: The Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River is a mustsee when coming to Yellowstone to witness the sheer beauty and power of the Yellowstone River. There are several trails one may take to experience this area, but I recommend starting at the North Rim and making your way to the iconic Artist Point.
- Wildlife Viewings: Hayden Valley is teeming with wildlife that is easily spotted while driving, with ample turnoffs to enjoy the many animal sightings you will undoubtedly see from bald eagles to bison!

TAXA habitats are built in Space City and designed by a NASA architect. How do they make stargazing easier?

Stargazing? Habitat design? Yes. We thought about that. We like looking up. All our habitats have red LED lights inside and out. Stargazers (and hunters and pilots) know we do that so that we can read star maps without our pupils dilating—making it easy to refer back and forth to the map so we can name the constellations with no adjustment time. Also, red lights make a great night light for sleeping kids and a great safety feature on the outside—marking the entry steps in a way that causes no light pollution at your campsite!

Mauna Kea, Hawaii

Mauna Kea on the island of Hawaii is ideal for stargazers to observe not just the night sky, but also the universe at large. However, it's one of Hawaii's most sacred places. Mauna Kea is a great place for astronomical observation because its summit is about 14,000 feet above sea level, the air is cool and dry, and there is minimal threat of light pollution. It's also situated near the equator, giving it a unique view of the stars. Stargazers can see part of the northern sky from the Southern Hemisphere, but not as far as the region around the North Pole.

Denali National Park, Alaska

In the night sky in Denali National Park, there's a good chance you'll see the glow of green, blue, and red dancing lights. Known as the northern lights, or aurora borealis, the celestial light show is an illustration of how the sun's weather affects Earth's skies. The surface of the sun is home to magnificent storms. It's constantly blowing streams of charged particles (also known as solar wind) through the solar system. When charged, the electrons produced by solar winds meet gases in the upper atmosphere, which causes a reaction that creates a neon light.

Death Valley National Park, California

Death Valley National Park is the largest International Dark-Sky Association (IDA)-designated dark sky park in the United States. It holds the record for the hottest temperature recorded on Earth and is also the driest place in North America. The arid climate makes this park one of the best places to see the stars. This park has no closing time, so bring your binoculars to explore the skies for yourself.

Cherry Springs State Park, Pennsylvania

Cherry Springs State Park in Pennsylvania works to stay in the dark. The 82-acre, gold-tier dark sky park is nestled in the Susquehannock State Forest. Stargazers have a sprawling area to set up camp and see the stars. Cherry Springs is unique in that it's far enough north that there are occasional sightings of the aurora borealis. Visitors also have a chance to see the Milky Way from horizon to horizon.

Wood Buffalo National Park, Canada

Wood Buffalo National Park spans more than 17,300 square miles of protected land and night skies. It's the largest dark sky preserve in the world, designated by the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada. Cold, clear winter nights offer the best viewing opportunities.



Foil-Baked Sweet Potatoes With Fillings



From The Family Camp Cookbook: Easy, Fun, and Delicious Meals to Enjoy Outdoors by Emily Vikre



You know what's even better than a baked potato? A baked sweet potato. Our family straight up lives off sweet potatoes. If you took away sweet potatoes, you would remove somewhere in the realm of 75 percent of the bulk of our diet. And while they seem boldly flavored—certainly compared to something mild and starchy such as a russet—their sweet creaminess actually works as the perfect foil to all sorts of other flavors. Just make sure you get enough salt and fat in there because salt + fat + sweet potatoes = a party. I'm giving you two topping options, but honestly, you could go wild with almost anything your heart desires (bacon, for example, or taco toppings, chili, barbecued chicken, the list goes on). Wrap your sweet potatoes well in foil and you can bake them in the embers of a campfire. They do take a bit of time to cook through, so this is a dinner to make when you have planned ahead, everyone has fun in-camp activities, and you have a box of wine at your side.

INGREDIENTS

For the Sweet Potatoes

4 medium sweet potatoes, washed Aluminum foil Butter or olive oil

_ .

Salt

Topping Option 1 (Not Vegetarian)

1 tablespoon (15 ml) olive oil

1 yellow onion, chopped

8 ounces (225 g) pre-cooked andouille sausage, cut into cubes

A few handfuls of baby spinach

(around 4 ounces [115 g])

Salt

Sour cream (optional)

Topping Option 2 (Vegetarian)

1/4 cup (59 ml) olive oil

1 yellow onion, thinly sliced

2 cloves garlic, thinly sliced

115-ounce (428 g) can chickpeas, drained

1 teaspoon turmeric

1 teaspoon sweet paprika

1 pinch red pepper flakes (if you like a little heat; omit if you don't)

Salt

Plain full-fat yogurt

Chopped cilantro

MAKE IT

Poke each sweet potato all over with a fork. This makes little holes in the skin to let steam escape and prevent exploding. Wrap each sweet potato in 2 or 3 layers of aluminum foil, sealing each layer well by rolling the edges over themselves. Nestle your sweet potatoes into the embers of your campfire (either of a campfire that has burned low or along the outer edges of a fire). Allow them to bake there, turning occasionally, until they are soft throughout. This will take around 45 minutes for medium-sized sweet potatoes, but it really depends on the heat of your embers and the size of your potatoes.

Remove from the embers (wear heat-resistant gloves or use tongs), open the aluminum wrapping, and let the potatoes cool for a couple minutes until you can handle them enough to slice them open down the middle. Slightly smash up the potatoes in the skins, sprinkle with salt, and either drizzle with olive oil or add a little bit of butter before adding your chosen topping.

For Topping 1

- Heat the oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat, then add the onion. Cook until well browned, about 5 minutes.
- 2. Stir in the chopped and ouille sausage and cook for a couple more minutes, stirring occasionally, until the sausage has started to brown on its sides. At the last minute, stir in the spinach and cook until it has just partially wilted, only 30 or so seconds. Season with salt if desired.
- 3. Scoop the sausage mixture into the sliced-open sweet potatoes. Top each with an additional dollop of sour cream, if desired.

For Topping 2

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat, then add the onion. Cook until the onion is softened and browning around the edges, about 3–5 minutes. Stir in the garlic, chickpeas, and spices and sprinkle with a bit of salt. Cook, stirring occasionally to make sure everything is cooking evenly, for about 10 minutes until everything has nicely browned and looks caramelized. Taste and add more salt if needed.
- 2. Scoop the chickpea mixture into the sliced-open sweet potatoes. Top with a dollop of plain yogurt and sprinkle generously with chopped cilantro.

His grandfather was an experimental airplane test engineer who rarely spoke, and his grandmother was a chain-smoking, chain-talking force of nature who was still teaching water aerobics at age ninety. When she was finally stuck living in a nursing home, she started a thriving business making and selling beaded jewelry to all the ladies in the home. In their early retirement, they were masters of car camping, traveling all over the country in a Lincoln Town Car with a closet bar across the back seat to keep their polyester leisure clothes from wrinkling. They had a sleek leather suitcase that held the essentials for their daily Old Fashioned. They really knew how to live.

INGREDIENTS

½ teaspoon maple syrup, or more to taste 2 dashes Angostura bitters 2 ounces (60 ml) rye whiskey or bourbon Orange-peel coin, for garnish

MAKE IT

Stir the maple syrup, bitters, and whiskey together in your cup. Taste and add another ½ teaspoon of syrup if desired. Squeeze the orange-peel coin, peel side facing down, over the cocktail to spritz orange oil over the cocktail. Add a piece or two of ice to your cocktail, give another stir, and enjoy.

Ask an Expert



What are a few hand-held lunch ideas that are good for eating away from the campsite?

I'm a big fan of solving the lunch-on-trail quandary with a Norwegian classic, the matpakke (there's a recipe for them in the lunch chapter of *The Family Camp Cookbook*). These are basic open-faced salami and cheese sandwiches that you wrap up to take with you and eat on the go. It seems simple—and it really is simple—but they are always delicious. Things become traditional for a reason. Just add a piece of fruit and some nuts or chocolate on the side, and you are ready to rumble.

I also rely on a lot of wraps. Tortillas are the perfect portable food vehicle. I usually don't pre-make the wraps though. I'll bring tortillas, some fillings, and a camping knife in a pack, so we can slice cheese, turkey, and avocado (for example) and stuff them in a tortilla right before eating.

Camping Activity Worksheet: 8 Spectacular Clouds





For many regions in North America, the change of seasons from winter to spring brings with it storms and showers. To help you make the most of your spring camping adventures, rain or shine, use this worksheet to learn about the clouds. Can you catch a glimpse of them all?

Lenticular Clouds

Lenticular clouds are most common near or downwind of mountain ranges. Their "flying saucer" appearance is owed to the forced ascent of stable air over mountain ranges. As long as the ambient weather conditions (winds, humidity) are unchanged, the cloud won't move, appearing to hover near the mountain range.





Asperitas Clouds

This is one of the newest clouds to be formally recognized, and the first since 1951. Latin for "roughness," these wavelike clouds are seen overhead after a thunderstorm's gust front has passed. Look skyward (from a safe place in a thunderstorm) and you may see these asperitas clouds.

Nacreous Clouds

Nacreous clouds, also known as "polar stratospheric" or "mother-of-pearl" clouds, occur in the Earth's stratosphere at heights of 9 to 16 miles above the Earth's surface. To see these smooth, iridescent clouds, you'll have to be in higher latitudes (northern Canada, Norway, or Alaska), typically near sunset or sunrise.





Billow Clouds

These interesting clouds, resembling a horizontal series of cresting waves, require a key ingredient: wind shear. Essentially what you're seeing in these cresting waves are stronger wind speeds at the top of the cloud, and lighter wind speeds at the bottom of the cloud. The horizontal circulations produced by these waves are areas of significant turbulence, and a major hazard for aircraft.

Cirrus Clouds

Cirrus clouds are the thin, wispy, high clouds often seen on fairweather days when lower clouds are not present to obscure them. Generally, these clouds are situated 20,000 to 30,000 feet above the ground. If you're on a cross-country flight and you're flying through clouds at cruising altitude, you're likely flying through cirrus.



Cumulonimbus Clouds

Cumulonimbus clouds are the tallest clouds in the atmosphere. They can stretch from bases just a few hundred feet above the ground to heights of over 50,000 feet. When a "parcel" of humid air starts to rise in an unstable environment, it keeps rising, and even accelerates, forming the giant heaping towers of billowing clouds that mark the presence of heavy rain showers and, often, powerful thunderstorms.

Mammatus Clouds

These clouds, often seen behind departing thunderstorms, appear to "hang" from the sky, suggesting that perhaps they are formed by sinking air, rather than the rising air that produces most clouds. As frightening as they appear, mammatus clouds are not dangerous and do not produce severe weather.





Shelf Clouds

Shelf clouds are produced when rain-cooled air from the base of a cumulonimbus cloud forms a gust front, forcing relatively warm, humid air ahead of it to rise and form a shelflike cloud formation. An approaching shelf cloud is your clue that strong straight-line winds may be approaching, and it's a good idea to head indoors for shelter. Shelf clouds tend to form at the front edge of a thunderstorm and bulge outward.






